Bye-Law 10: Student Networks

1. Definition

- 1.1. University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks are networks of students who share a recognised identity, personal or protected characteristic, or status as a student of the University.
- 1.2. University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks aim to provide a space for their members to represent themselves and voice their collective on views within the students, University, and local communities.
- 1.3. University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks aim to provide a space for students to network, socialise, and campaign.
- 1.4. The current, recognised University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks are:
 - i) Black and Ethnic Minority Students' Network
 - ii) Disabled Students' Network
 - iii) International Students' Network
 - iv) LGBTQ Network
 - v) Men's Network
 - vi) Parents & Carers Network
 - vii) Part-Time Students' Network
 - viii) Postgraduate Students' Network
 - ix) Return to Education Students' Network
 - x) Women's Network

2. Membership

- 2.1. Membership of all University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks shall be free
- 2.2. All members of the Union are eligible to join University of Cumbria Students' Union Student Networks so long as they self-define within parameters unique to each Student Network:
 - i) Black and Ethnic Minority Students' Network; members must self-define as black or any other ethnic minority.
 - ii) Disabled Students' Network; members must self-define as disabled; this includes physical disabilities, mental disabilities, and long-term illnesses.
 - iii) International Students' Network; members must be registered as an international student with the University or otherwise not a UK national or resident.
 - iv) LGBTQ Network; members must self-define as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual, questioning their sexuality or gender, or as an active ally.
 - v) Men's Network; members must self-define as a man.
 - vi) Parents & Carers Network; members must self-define as having parental or caring responsibilities.

- vii) Part-Time Students' Network; members must be registered on a parttime, Apprenticeship, work-based learning, or any other programme delivered on a part-time or primarily off-site basis.
- viii) Postgraduate Students' Network; members must be registered on a postgraduate programme of study or research.
- ix) Return to Education Students' Network; members commencing an undergraduate programme must be 21 years of age or above; members commencing a postgraduate programme must be 25 years of age or above.
- x) Women's Network; members must self-define as a woman.
- 2.3. Membership must be obtained via the Union website.

3. Decision-Making

- 3.1. In accordance with Bye-Law 8: Ideas & Policy, decisions may be delegated by Executive Committee to Student Networks.
- 3.2. Decisions made must be approved by the Student Network's membership.
- 3.3. If not originally specified by Executive Committee, the arrangements for decision-making or voting shall be at the discretion of the Student Network itself.

4. Creation or Dissolution of Student Networks

4.1. Student Networks may be created, split, or dissolved via policy approved in accordance with Bye-Law 8: Ideas & Policy.
